(3) MISSION/FUNCTION

The Board is both an adjudicatory and a regulatory body, charged with the economic regulation of the railroad industry and related surface transportation, including the transportation of grain. The purpose of the NGCC is to conduct a continuing dialogue to provide advice and guidance to the Board on grain transportation matters and to provide a forum for the informal resolution of disputes and controversies regarding grain transportation.

(4) POINTS OF VIEW

Based on understanding the purpose of the FAC,

The NGCC shall consist of approximately 42 members, excluding governmental representatives. There shall be a balanced representation of executives knowledgeable in the transportation of grain, including no fewer than 14 members from the Class I railroads (one marketing and one car management representative from each Class I), 7 representatives from Class II and III carriers, 14 representatives from grain shippers and receivers, and 7 representatives from private car owners and car manufacturers. All members shall serve in a representative capacity.

(5) OTHER BALANCE FACTORS

In addition, by considering geographical location and size, the agency seeks to maintain diversity among its members that do not represent the Class I railroads.

(6) CANDIDATE IDENTIFICATION PROCESS

The Chairman of the Board will solicit nominations for the NGCC from appropriate carrier, shipper, grain elevator, car lessor, and consumer organizations and associations. In addition, the Chairman may solicit nominations through the Federal Register. Members of the NGCC shall be selected from the nominees by the Chairman of the Board, with the concurrence of a majority of the members of the Board. Vacancies will be filled by the same process.

Members will be invited to serve for a term of two (2) years. Members may serve more than one term.
