# REGULATIONS GOVERNING FEES FOR SERVICES PERFORMED IN CONNECTION WITH LICENSING AND RELATED SERVICES–2004 UPDATE

Decided September 24, 2004

The Board adopts the 2004 User Fee Update.

## BY THE BOARD:

## **BACKGROUND**

The Surface Transportation Board (Board or STB) is *required* by regulations at 49 CFR 1002.3 to update its user fees annually. The Board's regulation at 49 CFR 1002.3(a) provides that the entire fee schedule or selected fees can be modified more than once a year, if necessary. The Board's fees are revised based on the cost study formula set forth at 49 CFR 1002.3(d). In previous years, selected fees have been modified to reflect new cost study data or changes in agency fee policy. The Board's last annual user fee update was issued in *Regulations Governing Fees for Services Performed in Connection with Licensing and Related Services*–2003, 7 S.T.B. 39 (2003) (2003 Fee Update).

Because Board employees received a salary increase of 4.42% in January 2004, the Board is updating its user fees to recover those costs. All fees, with the exception of those discussed below, will be updated based on the cost formula at 49 CFR 1002.3(d). The Board notes that its master fee schedule has been amended to include those new and revised fees contained in the 2002 New Fees decision.

# 2004 UPDATE FACTORS

For this update, the direct labor cost data have been revised to reflect the combined 2004 Government-wide general salary and 2004 locality salary increase of 4.42% that took effect in January 2004. The Government Fringe Benefit Cost used in the update formula remains at 49.55%. Based on the Board's fiscal year (FY) 2003 actual budget data, its Office General and Administrative Expense Factor has decreased slightly from 22.09% to 21.96%, and its Operations Overhead Factor, which is developed from FY 2003 payroll cost data, has also decreased from 23.15% to 22.31%. Meanwhile, the Board's General and Administrative Expense Factor has

increased from 9.07% to 12.87%. This significant change of approximately 40% is due to the fact that the Board's Office of the Secretary was abolished and certain of that Office's employees were reassigned to positions that are currently captured through the Board's General and Administrative Expense Factor (increased from approximately 15 employees in FY 2002 to 22 employees in FY 2003). The 2004 full cost for each fee item developed from these factors is set forth in APPENDIX A.

#### FEDERAL REGISTER COST

On March 1, 2002, the cost of publishing documents in the *Federal Register* was increased to \$155 per column. The minimum cost of publishing a document also was increased to \$155. The \$155 represented an increase of approximately 4.73% over the then-existing \$148 level of *Federal Register* costs. Based on an inquiry made to the United States Government Printing Office, the 4.73% increase is still applicable and called for in this proceeding. Therefore, the publication costs reflected here are at the same level of rates as those included in the *2003 Fee Update*. Moreover, no additional publication cost is anticipated at this time.

## FEE ITEMS INCREASED BASED ON ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

## Formal Complaints:

In Regulations Governing Fees for Service--1996 Update, 1 S.T.B. 179 (1996) (1996 Fee Update I), based on concerns expressed by various parties commenting in that decision, the Board determined that fees for formal complaints should be set at 10% of full cost and increased gradually to the full cost level. However, because of ongoing legislative debate regarding complaint fees when 1996 Fee Update I was decided, the Board maintained all complaint fees at \$1,000.

In Regulations Governing Fees for Services Performed in Connection with Licensing and Related Services-1996 Update, 1 S.T.B. 883 (1996) (1996 Fee Update II), the Board established fees for coal rail rate complaint cases and for all other types of complaints, except those that involve rail maximum rate complaints filed by small shippers, at \$23,300 and \$2,300, respectively. Those fees became effective on January 16, 1997, and remained in effect until the Board's decision in Regulations Governing Fees for Services Performed in Connection with Licensing and Related Services--1998 Update, 3 S.T.B. 11 (1998) (1998 Fee Update), at which time the fees, based on a cost-of-living update and overhead changes, increased to \$27,000 and \$2,600, respectively. For the year 1999, in Regulations Governing Fees for Services Performed in Connection with Licensing and Related Services--1999 Update, 4 S.T.B. 5 (1999) (1999 Fee Update) the Board increased the percentage from 10% to

20% of full cost<sup>2</sup> and set the two fee items at \$54,500 and \$5,400, respectively. Because of continuing legislative debate over the Board's rail rate reasonableness procedures, the Board has held the percentage at 20% of full cost since the *1999 Fee Update* decision. However, during the time period from 1999 through 2003, cost-of-living increases have been applied to the direct labor costs, as well as changes to the STB overheads for these fee items.

Below is a summary of the user fee updates for formal complaints for the years 2000 through 2003. The table contains the filing fee amounts and changes to the fee amounts from the prior year for both the maximum coal rate complaint cases and for all other formal complaint cases.

For the 2004 Fee Update, the Board is continuing to maintain these complaint fee items at 20% of full cost. Based on the 20% calculation, the

For the 2000 update, the Board adopted a fee for item 56(i), Formal complaints filed under the coal rate guidelines, set at \$55,000 per filing [\$275,479.82 (total 2000 cost) times 20% and then rounded]. The Board also adopted the fee for item 56(ii), All other formal complaints, set at \$5,400 per filing [\$27,332.27 (total 2000 cost) times 20% and then rounded].

The Board adopted a fee for item 56(i), Formal complaints filed under the coal rate guidelines, set at \$57,500 per filing [\$287,749.20 (total 2001 cost) times 20% and then rounded]. It also adopted the fee for item 56(ii), All other formal complaints, set at \$5,700 per filing [\$28,549.60 (total 2001 cost) times 20% and then rounded].

The Board adopted a fee for item 56(i), Formal complaints filed under the coal rate guidelines, set at \$62,100 per filing [\$310,623.05 (total 2003 cost) times 20% and then rounded]. The Board also adopted a fee for item 56(ii), All other formal complaints, set at \$6,100 per filing [\$30,819.06 (total 2003 cost) times 20% and then rounded].

filing fees for these two types of complaint proceedings, are set at \$66,600 (\$4,500 increase over the 2003 fee) and \$6,600 (\$500 increase over the 2003 fee), respectively.<sup>7</sup>

#### Other Below-Cost Fees:

In the 2002 New Fees decision, the Board raised from \$150 to \$200, the filing fees established in the 1996 Fee Update I and 1996 Fee Update II decisions for items involving trails use requests – item 27(i); Amtrak conveyance and compensation proceedings – items 47 and 48, respectively; appeals to Board decisions – item 61(i); motor carrier undercharge proceedings – item 62; and labor arbitration proceedings – item 60. Fees for these six items remain at the \$200 level in this proceeding. In addition, the fee for item 13, A feeder line development program, remains at \$2,600, and fees for item 58(i), Petition for declaratory order involving a dispute over an existing rate or practice, and item 58(ii), All other petitions for declaratory order, are held at their current levels of \$1,000 and \$1,400, respectively.

## NEW AND REVISED FEE ITEMS

New and revised fee items were adopted by the Board in the 2002 New Fees decision. That decision became effective on April 28, 2004. In that proceeding the Board added 19 new fee or sub-fee items to its user fee schedule and, as mentioned in the paragraph above, increased to \$200 the six fee items previously capped at \$150. In addition, six of the 19 new fee or sub-fee items were capped for reasons discussed in either the 2002 New Fees decision or in the NPR decision to that proceeding. The six new capped fee items are: item 12(iv), A request for determination of a dispute involving a rail construction that crosses the line of another carrier; item 56(ii), A formal complaint involving rail maximum rates filed under the small rate case procedures; item 56(v), A request for an order compelling a rail carrier to establish a common carrier rate; items 63(i) and 63(ii), A request for expedited or temporary relief for service emergency or service inadequacy, respectively; and item 88, Basic fee for STB adjudicatory services not otherwise covered. Except for the fee for item 56(ii), all new capped item fees were set at \$200. The capped fee for item 56(ii) was set at \$150.

Also in 2002 New Fees, the Board amended and updated nine existing fee or sub-fee items to reflect Board processing changes. These amendments and updates dealt with Carload Waybill Sample requests and Uniform Railroad Costing System (URCS) software and information requests, and also entailed deletion of several fee and sub-fee items. Finally, the Board changed the

language contained in a few of the user fee regulations at 49 CFR 1002 in order to clarify the scope and applicability of those fee items.

In this proceeding the Board is updating fee items adopted in 2002 New Fees to reflect the 2004 direct labor and overhead cost levels. This is necessary because the direct labor and overhead costs contained in the 2002 New Fees decision were based on 2001 cost levels. Thus, all fee and sub-fee items in the 2004 Fee Update are reflected at the 2004 direct labor and overhead cost levels.

## RESULTS FROM THE 2004 UPDATE

The Board's current master fee schedule contains 127 fee or sub-fee items (the old master schedule contained 114 fee or sub-fee items). In this decision, 104 of the 127 items (81.9%) are either unchanged (40 items) or increased by \$500 or less (64 items). Of the 104 items, 78 or approximately 75% either remain unchanged (40 items) or are increased by \$100 or less (38 items). Moreover, of the 23 fee or sub-fee items that are increased by more than \$500, 15 of them have been increased by more than \$1,000 but of that number, only five items reflect any activity with the STB at the present time. The five items include: applications and petitions for the construction of new rail lines – items 12(i) and 12(iii); abandonment applications – item 21(i); offers of financial assistance – set terms and conditions – item 26; and rail maximum coal stand-alone complaints – items 56(i).

# NOTICE AND COMMENT REQUIREMENT

The fee increases adopted here generally are a product of the mechanical application of the current update formula at 49 CFR 1002.3(d), which was adopted through notice and comment procedures in *Regulations Governing Fees for Services-1987 Update*, 4 I.C.C.2d 137 (1987). This decision contains no new fee or sub-fee items. Accordingly, notice and comment are unnecessary for this proceeding. *See Regulations Governing Fees For Services-1990 Update*, 7 I.C.C.2d 3 (1990); *Regulations Governing Fees For Services-1991 Update*, 8 I.C.C.2d 13 (1991); and *Regulations Governing Fees For Services-1993 Update*, 9 I.C.C.2d 855 (1993).

#### REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ANALYSIS

The Board certifies that these rules will not have a significant economic effect on a substantial number of small entities because the Board's regulations provide for waiver of filing fees for those entities that can make the required showing of financial hardship.
