CP's US network continues to be fluid and in good operating condition, as it has for many months. Again this week, system average train speed, weekly average terminal dwell, and cars on line data are all good.

Grain car demand and performance remained steady this reporting week. We received 1293 new grain car orders, and spotted a total of 2314 grain cars, which total includes single cars and cars in dedicated trains. The number of outstanding grain car orders this week is 1332.
