I am writing to provide comment on the service data that we are filing contemporaneous herewith in response to the Board's data collection order of October 8, 2014.

CP's US network continues to be fluid and in good operating condition, as it has for many months. System average train speed, weekly average terminal dwell, and cars on line data are all good.

Grain remains steady. This reporting week we received 1297 new grain car orders, and spotted a total of 2144 grain cars, which total includes single cars and cars in dedicated trains. The number of outstanding grain car orders this week is 2367. We anticipate grain car cycle times will be affected by a derailment on an interchange carrier and weather in North Dakota. We will work with each component in the supply chain to minimize the effect.
