I am writing to provide comment on the service data that we are filing contemporaneous herewith in response to the Board's data collection order of October 8, 2014.

CP's US network continues to be fluid and in good operating condition, as it has for many months. System average train speed, weekly average terminal dwell, and cars on line data are all good.

This reporting week we received 976 new grain car orders, and spotted a total of 2061 grain cars, which total includes single cars and cars in dedicated trains. The number of outstanding grain car orders this week is 4333.

We continue to experience off-line weather related issues in the Pacific Northwest corridor which affect our grain car cycles. We are working with other carriers as well as our customers to minimize the effects and to remedy the situation.
